Tips for Student Success

Finals week doesn't have to stress you out. Here are a few tips to help you survive the exam-packed end of the semester:

- Plan out your schedule. Be sure to include study time, study breaks, classes, work, exercise - and sleep!
- Prioritize. Figure out what exams you need to spend the most time studying for and focus on those first.
- Talk to others. If you're having trouble with a particular subject, stop by a study group or make an appointment to talk with the professor.
- Limit your activities. During finals week, ask your boss if you can cut back on your hours. Also, put off shopping trips, and let your friends and family know you're not available for social activities.
- Don't stress out. Yes, finals are important, but they're not worth making yourself sick over. In fact, excessive stress can actually hurt your performance on exams! So plan ahead, do your best and stop worrying.
- Pick the study skill method that works best for you - and use it.
- Arrive early for the exam. Screeching in at the last minute will only add to your anxiety.
- Don't compare yourself. While you're taking a test, don't worry about other students finishing before you. Just because they finished first doesn't mean they did better on the exam. Take the time you need to do your best.
- Move on. After the exam is over, don't overanalyze how you did. If you're really worried about something, go meet with the teacher to discuss your concerns.
