Winter 2009 Basic Scholarship Applications Now Available

Applications for Doyon Foundation's basic scholarships for the 2009 winter semester are now available online at www.doyonfoundation.com. Applications are due September 15, 2009. Please note these scholarships are for vocational students only.

(Doyon Foundation's definition of vocational is any student enrolled in a one- to three-year training or associate's degree program.)

The scholarships range from \$400 for part-time students to \$800 for full-time students. To apply, students must submit:

- · A complete application form.
- · Proof of academic enrollment.
- · Official transcripts.

Students are encouraged to apply for scholarships online. If students do not already have an online account, they should create one at www.doyonfoundation.com/CreateAccount.aspx. This should be done at least seven days in advance of the scholarship application deadline.

Please note that all scholarship applications, including basic, vocational and competitive, will need to be submitted online starting with the November 15, 2009 application deadline for spring 2010 scholarships. Additional information about this change will be provided in the coming months.
