Doyon Foundation's eighth annual Morris Thompson Memorial Golf Classic was held June 19 - 20 at the Chena Bend Golf Course on Fort Wainwright in Fairbanks. A silent auction fundraiser for the newly established Georgianna Lincoln Scholarship Fund was also held on June 19 as part of the golf classic reception. Together, these events raised nearly \$200,000 for competitive scholarships.

A total of 124 golfers participated in this year's classic, and more than \$185,000 in gross monetary and in-kind donations was raised. Proceeds from the classic support the Morris Thompson Scholarship Fund, which allows Doyon Foundation to award annual competitive scholarships to Alaska Native higher education students pursuing degrees in business management or leadership. During the 2008 - 2009 academic year, Doyon Foundation expects to award \$52,000 in Morris Thompson scholarships.

The silent auction, which featured items such as a boat trip with Harold Attla, the current Yukon 800 champion, as well as beautiful Native artwork, raised approximately \$11,000 for the Georgianna Lincoln Scholarship Fund, which enables the Foundation to provide even more scholarships to Alaska Native students.

Tips for Student Success

Our students' safety is a top priority for Doyon Foundation, and we believe the beginning of the school year is an excellent time to review campus safety tips. Please take a moment to look over these tips, which we shared in a previous issue of our e-newsletter. We also encourage you to share them with family, friends and roommates!

- Never walk alone at night. Travel in groups, use a shuttle service, and walk in busy, well-lit areas. Stay away from shrubs, dark doorways and alleys. Be aware of your surroundings at all times.
- Share your schedule with family and friends. If you're going to be working or attending classes late, let someone know what your plans are and when to expect you back.
- Program your phone's speed dial with emergency numbers, and make sure your friends, roommates and family members have each other's phone numbers, in case of an emergency.
- Get to know your neighbors.
- Don't loan your keys to anyone. If your keys are lost or stolen, have your locks re-keyed.
- Keep your residence door locked at all times. Don't let strangers into your residence, prop your dorm room open or agree to leave your door unlocked - even if a roommate asks you to.
- Lock your vehicle doors, even while driving, and don't transport people you don't know.
- Never leave your ID, wallet, purse, checkbook, jewelry, camera or other valuables unattended or in plain sight. In your car, be sure to place valuables out of sight or take them with you.
- Never be alone with someone you just met, and never leave a drink unattended or accept a drink from a stranger.
- Report crimes, suspected crimes, or suspicious people or activities to your campus security or police department.
- Many campuses have emergency phones located throughout campus. Find out if your campus has emergency phones and, if so, familiarize yourself with the locations.
- Contact your campus security or police department to review crime statistics at your school, or at a school you are considering attending.
- Trust your instincts! If you have a feeling that something is wrong, get to a well-traveled, well-lit area or head for an emergency phone, the campus police department or your dorm.
