

Online Applications & Student Accounts

Scholarship applications must be completed and submitted online.

To apply for scholarships online, students should first create an online account, if they do not already have one. Accounts may be created at www.doyonfoundation.com/CreateAccount.aspx. Students should create an account at least seven days in advance of the scholarship application deadline, as it may take several days for Foundation staff to verify a student's shareholder status.

Scholarship Programs



Scholarship Programs

As Doyon, Limited's private foundation, Doyon Foundation serves the educational and cultural needs of Doyon's shareholders and their children. Since inception in 1989, the Foundation has awarded more than \$6 million in scholarships.

Scholarship Eligibility

To be eligible for a Doyon Foundation scholarship, applicants must:

- Be enrolled to Doyon, Limited or be the child of an original enrollee. If applicant is not an original enrollee, but is the child of an original enrollee, please submit a birth certificate. Gifted or inherited shares do not qualify.
- Be accepted to an accredited college, university, technical or vocational school.
- Maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 for undergraduates, 3.0 for graduates or masters, and 3.25 for specialists or doctorates.
- Be enrolled in 12 or more credits (undergraduates), or 9 or more credits (graduates) to be considered full-time students.
- Be enrolled in 6 to 11 credits (undergraduates), or 2 to 8 credits (graduates) to be considered part-time students.

Scholarship Deadlines

All scholarship application materials must be received online by:

- **March 15** – Basic scholarships for summer semester.
- **May 15** – Basic and competitive scholarships for fall semester.
- **November 15** – Basic scholarships for spring semester.

Please note that basic, short-term vocational and advanced college credit scholarships are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.

Types of Scholarships

Doyon Foundation offers four types of scholarships, including:

Competitive

- Range from \$5,000 to \$9,000*.
- Awarded once per year.

* Amounts vary for special competitive scholarships, such as corporate-funded, field-specific and memorial scholarships.

Basic

- Range from \$800 for part-time students to \$1,200 for full-time students.
- Awarded three times per year.

Short-Term Vocational

- Covers the course cost (up to \$1,000).
- Awarded year-round.
- Students eligible to receive once per academic year.

Advanced College Credit

- Covers the course cost (up to \$400).
- Awarded year-round to high school students taking college courses, if their school district does not offer funding.



Application Requirements

Competitive scholarship applicants must submit:

- Online competitive scholarship application.
- Signed release and consent form.
- Online personal essay.
- Official transcripts* from last school attended or GED scores.
- Proof of academic enrollment.
- Two professional letters of reference (*to be sent directly from the author to the Foundation*).

Basic scholarship applicants must submit:

- Online basic scholarship application.
- Signed release and consent form.
- Proof of academic enrollment.
- Official transcripts* from last school attended or GED scores.

Short-term vocational and advanced college credit scholarship applicants must submit:

- Online short-term vocational/advanced college credit application.
- Signed release and consent form (*if under 18, parent must sign*).
- Proof of academic enrollment (must show enrollment, cost of the course/ training and credits received).
- Original transcripts* from the last school attended, GED scores (for short-term vocational scholarship applicants), or current official transcripts* (for advanced college credit scholarship applicants).

* Official transcripts must be submitted the first time a student applies for a scholarship in an academic year, which runs August through July. Unofficial transcripts are acceptable for subsequent applications during the same academic year.
