Update on Flooding and Relief Efforts in Eagle

Intense flooding in the community of Eagle has displaced approximately 30 families and destroyed several homes, according to the Alaska State Troopers, who flew into Eagle yesterday with personnel from the Emergency Operation Center and the Homeland Security Office to assist the National Park Service. According to the KTUU Web site, Alaska Gov. Sarah Palin has issued a disaster declaration, which she said will pave the way for a rapid response from the state and eventually federal assistance.

Individuals and organizations across the state are coming together to support residents in Eagle. The Eagle Disaster Account has been set up at Denali State Bank, and monetary donations are welcomed. The Tok Chamber of Commerce has also designated the Log Visitor Center building as a collection center for supplies and donations that need to go to Eagle. Needs include underwear, socks, t-shirts, sweat pants and other clothes, as well as food and supplies like diapers, paper products and fuel.

Competitive Scholarship Review Committee Seats Open

To qualify for a position, candidates must:

- Meet with Doyon Foundation administration to review and recommend competitive scholarship policy changes in June.

Service on the scholarship review committee is on a voluntary basis. Interested candidates should submit a résumé and a letter of interest outlining why they'd like to serve by May 8, 2009. The Doyon Foundation board of directors will select the members at their next regularly scheduled meeting in Fairbanks. The time and date of that meeting is to be announced.
