High school students? Our Kickstart award offers up to \$400 for college courses!

Non-degree-seeking students? Our Level Up scholarship offers up to \$3,000 for programs, trainings or courses less than 120 hours. It can also pay for LSAT, MCAT, GRE, GMAT and other required testing!

MANY PATHWAYS TO SUCCESS

We believe there are many pathways to success – and success looks different to each of us. We offer a range of scholarships to meet the diverse needs of Doyon shareholders and their descendants who are pursuing their educational dreams.

KICKSTART

For high school students
Up to \$400

High school students eligible to receive this award as long as their school district does not pay for advanced placement classes. Covers the actual cost of the course or program, not to exceed \$400. Funded on a first-come, first-served basis.



COMPETITIVE

Undergraduate or less \$7,000

Graduate **\$9,000**

Doctorate **\$11,000**

Awarded once per year to full-time, degree-seeking students. Students receive half the award for the fall semester and half for the spring.



PART- & FULL-TIME-AWARD

Part-Time **\$1,600**

Full-Time **\$2,400**

Awarded three times per year to part-time and full-time, degree-seeking students. Students must submit an application for each semester they wish to receive funding. Funded on a first-come, first-served basis.



LEVEL UP

For non-degree-seeking students
Up to \$3,000

For non-degree-seeking students in programs, trainings or courses less than 120 hours. It can also pay for LSAT, MCAT, GRE, GMAT and other required testing. Covers the actual cost, not to exceed \$3,000. Students eligible to receive once per academic year.



SECOND

We believe all students should have the opportunity to pursue their educational goals! If you don't meet our scholarship requirements, such as the minimum GPA, please contact us to learn more about our Second Chance opportunity.

SCHOLARSHIP

HOW TO APPLY

Foundation scholarship applications are only accepted online, and new students must create an online account in advance before applying. (If you don't have computer or internet access, give us a call and we can help you complete your scholarship application by proxy.)

DON'T WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE!

Give yourself plenty of time to pull together the required materials, including proof of academic enrollment and transcripts. Our staff also needs time to complete the shareholder verification process for each student.

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

To qualify for a Doyon Foundation scholarship, applicants must:

- Be enrolled to Doyon, Limited or be the child of an original enrollee.
- ★ Be accepted to an accredited college, university, technical or vocational school.
- Maintain a minimum GPA.
- Be enrolled in minimum number of credits.

GET INVOLVED WITH DLO IN THE CLASSROOM

In fall 2022, we received a federal grant for our newest project, which will increase the capacity of schools to teach Alaska Native languages, and provide increased language learning opportunities for students. We're piloting the project at Effie Kokrine Charter School in Fairbanks, and hope to expand the model to other Doyon region schools. Our first cohort of mentors and apprentices began their year-long language immersion journey in summer 2022. The original grant allowed us to fund 10 teams. However, with additional generous funding approved by the Doyon Foundation board, we were able to fully fund an additional five teams, for a total of 15 teams in our first cohort.
